We have already raised \$550,000 for the ICCW project, leaving an additional \$85,000 needed to fully fund the project. We are confident that the remaining funds will be donated. We are also pleased to report that the Holy Innocents Hospital is operating profitably and enjoys tremendous support in the Mbararra community. An additional 12 patient ward is under construction to accommodate the increasing number of patients. The Hospital itself acquired the funds for this new inpatient facility.
