## Our Current Need: a Dedicated Neonatal Intensive Care Unit

You may have heard that our final project for Holy Innocents Children's Hospital would be construction of additional housing for the Hospital's medical staff. Recently, a new priority has arisen. The government of Uganda has designated Holy Innocents a Regional Resource Hospital for infants. This means that seven local hospitals are referring all their cases involving premature newborns and other babies in critical condition to Holy Innocents.

As a consequence, the number of infants needing intensive care has increased dramatically. Holy Innocents urgently needs to increase beds available in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit ("NICU"). The Governing Board of the hospital has asked us to construct and furnish a new NICU ward. We have agreed to take on this project and cancel the construction of additional staff housing. After all, the babies come first.

Although the construction of the dedicated NICU ward presents a challenge, it is also a testament to the great success we have achieved. The Ugandan government has recognized Holy Innocents' excellence in treating those children most at risk.
